Dear Members,

Your Directors are pleased to present the 35th Annual Report on the business and operations of the Company along with audited statements of accounts for the year ended 31st March 2015.

CORPORATE REVIEW

The prices of Paper remained under pressure during the year under review. Among other reasons, signing of Free Trade Agreement [FTA] with ASEAN countries permitting import of paper at nil custom duty resulted in cheaper imports, especially in the market near the ports, affecting the overall sentiments in the industry. Also during the year short shutdowns were taken in both the divisions of the Company for up-gradation purposes, which resulted in lower production. This resulted in more than 7% fall in total revenues from ₹403.17 crores to ₹373.49 crores. It was due to fall in production. PBIDT of Company stood at ₹27.90 crores against ₹37.56 crores of last year. Net profit after tax at ₹9.80 crores were almost 20% lower as compared to ₹12.64 crores of last year. Prices of various inputs remain range bound during the year. Other expenses were also under control. Cheaper imports remain a cause of concern in the current year also. However, your Directors do hope that with continuous efforts put in by the employees of the Company and innovative steps being undertaken by the Management, Company should continue to show satisfactory results in the years to come.

PERFORMANCE REVIEW**SHREYANS PAPERS**

Total paper production in this division was lower at 43307 MTs against 45350 MTs of last year, mainly due to shutdown taken for installation of state-of-art Head Box on the machine during the year. However, other operations of the unit remained satisfactory. Total revenues of the division at ₹228.43 crores against ₹230.32 crores were lower by only one percent due to reasons mentioned above.

SHREE RISHABH PAPERS

As mentioned above, a shutdown was taken in this unit for up-gradation of the Press and Dryer section. Production in this division was lower at 28555 MTs against 34088 MTs of last year due to above mentioned shutdown and also changes in product-mix to lower grammage due to market conditions, showing almost 16% decline. Revenues of the unit at ₹145.06 crores

against ₹172.85 crores were also lower. This was because of lower production and market conditions.

FINANCIAL REVIEW**SHARE CAPITAL**

The paid up Equity Share Capital as on March 31, 2015 was ₹13.82 crores. During the year under review, the Company has neither issued any shares nor granted stock options and nor sweat equity.

FINANCE

Fresh long term debt for ₹5.14 crores was raised during the year. However, existing term debts to the extent of ₹4.29 crores were repaid. The company continues to focus on judicious management of its working capital. Receivables, inventories and other working capital parameters were kept under strict check through continuous monitoring.

The Company donot propose to carry any amount to any reserves.

DIVIDEND

Your Directors recommend a dividend of ₹1.20 per share [i.e. 12%] for the financial year ended 31st March 2015 (previous year 12%). The dividend, if approved by the shareholders, will be paid to all the equity shareholders whose names appear in the Register of Members as on 5th August, 2015. The proposed dividend will cost the Company ₹2.00 crores, inclusive of all taxes.

At the end of the year, fixed deposits from the public and Directors were outstanding to the tune of ₹3.25 crore and ₹0.52 crore respectively. There were no overdue deposits as on

31st March 2015. The company has accepted deposits from the members falling within the ambit of Section 73 of the Companies Act, 2013 and The Companies [Acceptance of Deposits] Rules, 2014. The company shall repay the deposits accepted before the commencement of the Companies Act 2013, as and when due, as per rule 19 and pursuant to provisions of sub section [2] of section 76 of the Act.

FUTURE PLANS/PROSPECTS

Your company believes in keeping up with latest technologies and is also committed to meet various environmental standards, which are being made most stringent on continuous basis. Pulp mill at Shreyans Papers division is under complete revamp. State-of-art Oxygen Delignification System is also being installed to improve quality of paper and also environmental performance. Heated calender is being installed on the paper machine to improve surface quality of paper. It was mentioned in last year's report that company plans to add equipment for producing surface sized paper, however, due to some operational problems; this could not be done during previous year. We expect that this equipment will also be commissioned during the current year. Total capex plan for these projects is approx. ₹31.00 crores. Necessary financial arrangements have already been tied up. Company proposes to raise additional term loan of ₹20.00 crores from its bankers, which has already been sanctioned. Orders for major equipments have been placed with reputed suppliers and it is expected that all these projects will be commissioned during the current year, resulting in further improvement in the operations of the Company.

After certain modifications in both the paper divisions, the combined present capacity for manufacture of Writing and Printing Paper stands at 78,000 MTs per annum.

India ranks 15th among the paper producing countries in the world. Paper industry in India is highly fragmented. There are over 700 mills spread across the country, capacity ranging from 5 TPD to over 1200 TPD. Total installed capacity is estimated at 12 million tones with production of about 11.00 million tones. The products are broadly classified as [1] Newsprint, [2] Writing and Printing Paper, and [3] Industrial and specialty papers. Your Company produces Writing and Printing Paper.

Based on usage of raw material, Paper Mills are divided into three categories namely, wood-based, agro-based and waste paper based [recycled fiber]. Your Company uses agro waste raw materials, viz. wheat straw, sarkanda as the primary raw materials.

Writing and Printing Paper accounts for about 35%, Newsprint 20% and Industrial and specialty papers 45%. The per capita consumption of paper is about 12 Kg. against the world average of 50 Kg. and Asian average of 40 Kg.

With the continuous growth of economy and improvement in literacy rate and standard of living, the demand for paper and paper products is growing at an annual average rate of 5 – 6%. The demand growth in the next three years is likely to be the same in Writing and Printing Paper. However, there could be some pressure on consumption of this variety of paper due to increasing emphasis on e-governance and motivation towards "Digital India". Your company is keeping a close watch on the developments to take corrective actions, if found necessary. Raw materials availability and strict environment regulations are the major entry barriers for the industry.

INTERNAL CONTROL SYSTEMS AND THEIR ADEQUACY

The Company has well defined internal control system. The Company takes abundant care to design, review and monitor the working of internal control system. Internal Audit in the organization is an independent appraisal activity and it measures the efficiency, adequacy and effectiveness of other controls in the organization. All significant issues are brought to the attention of the Audit Committee of the Board.

HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT AND INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS

The human resources development function of the Company is guided by a strong set of values and policies. Your company strives to provide the best work environment with ample opportunities to grow and explore. Your company maintains a work environment that is free from any harassment.

Company enjoys excellent relationship with its personnel and considers them as an essential part of the organization.

Development and well being of people working for the Company has been a corner stone of management policy. This is reflected through very low employees' turnover at all levels including workers, staff, officers and managers.

Company lays special emphasis on staff training and retraining through internal workshops and also nominating staff/officers to various training programmes. As on 31st March 2015, Company has 1332 employees consisting of 83 managers, 321 staff/officers and 928 workers.

CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY INITIATIVES

Your company, in collaboration with a local NGO in Ahmedgarh, has set up an Eye Hospital. Besides contributing in setting up of this hospital, financial assistance is extended on monthly basis. Eye care is provided to needy persons on subsidized rates/free of cost.

Your company is also involved with various educational institutions for providing scholarship to deserving students on recommendations of the managements of such institutions.

Your company actively participates with number of NGOs for holding medical check-up camps, sports events and other social activities.

Your Company provides fire fighting services, as and when need arises, in nearby areas through its own fire tender and fire fighting staff.

OUTLOOK

As mentioned in the earlier part of the report, there are certain causes of concern as far as demand for writing and printing paper is concerned. These include significant quantity of cheaper imports of material from nearby countries, increasing emphasis on e-governance and e-learning, which directly affect the consumption of cultural varieties of paper. However, increasing emphasis on education, faster growth rate in economy and increasing standards of living, shall support increase per capita paper consumption. Company expects that it shall be able to meet its products comfortably in years to come. However, a close watch is constantly kept on various developments and diversification of product range whenever found necessary will be undertaken. Company shall also look forward business opportunities, if situation so warrants. Eco-friendly technology adopted by the Company, motivated manpower and market leadership vision makes future outlook quite optimistic.

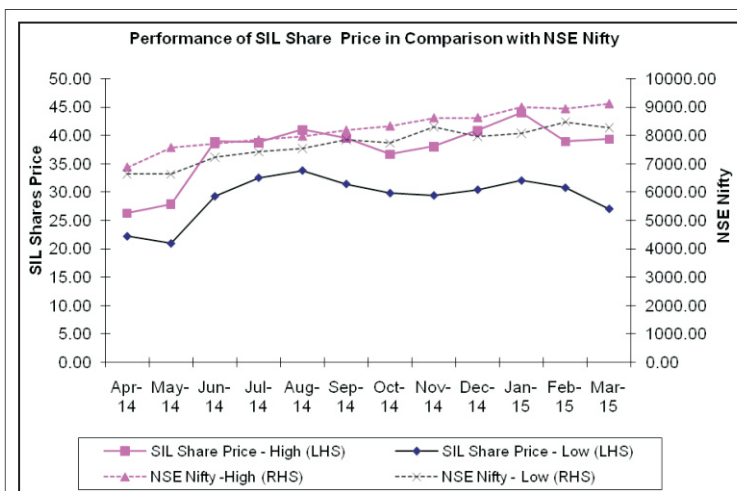
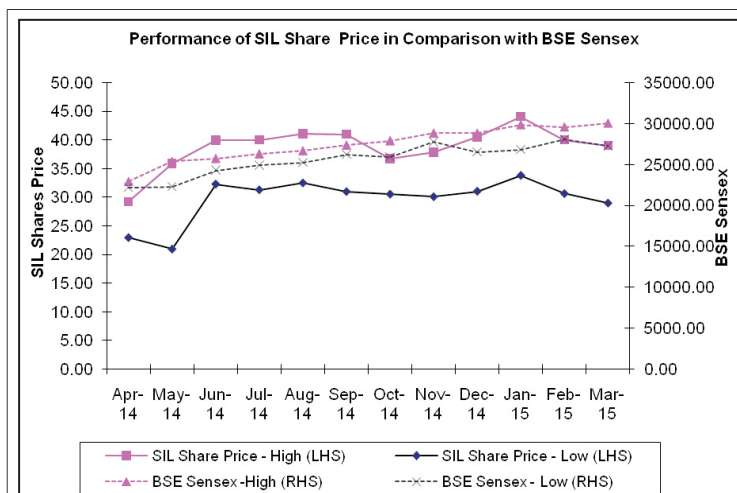

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED MARCH 31, 2015**1 Corporate Information**

Shreyans Industries Limited (the Company) is a public company incorporated under the provisions of the Companies Act, 1956 on 11th June, 1979. The name of the company at its incorporation was Shreyans Paper Mills Ltd. and subsequently changed to Shreyans Industries Limited on 20th October 1992. The company is engaged in manufacturing of Writing and Printing Paper.

Significant Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts**2 Significant Accounting Policies****(a) Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements**

The financial statements are prepared on accrual basis under the historical cost convention in accordance with the accounting standards referred to in section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rule 2014.

(b) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements, in conformity with the generally accepted accounting principles, require estimates and assumptions to be made that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities as of the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results known materialise.

(c) Revenue Recognition**(i) Sales**

Revenue from sale of goods is recognised;

- (a) When all the significant risks and rewards of ownership transferred to the buyer and the company retains no effective control of the goods transferred to a degree usually associated with ownership; and
- (b) No significant uncertainty exists regarding the amount of the consideration that will be derived from the sale of goods.

(ii) Export Incentives:

Revenue in respect of export incentives is recognised on post export basis.

(iii) Interest :

Revenue from interest is recognized on a time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and the rate applicable.

(iv) Dividend

Dividend Income from investment is recognized when the right to receive payment is established.

(v) Insurance and Other Claims

Revenue in respect of claims is recognized when no significant uncertainty exists with regard to the amount to be realized and the ultimate collection thereof.

(d) Employees Benefits**(i) Short Term Employees Benefits**

Short Term Employees Benefits are recognized as an expense on an undiscounted basis in the statement of profit and loss of the year in which the related service is rendered.

(ii) Post Employment Benefits**i) Defined Contribution Plans****a) Provident Fund:**

The Employer's Contribution to provident fund is made in accordance with the provisions of the Employee's Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 and is recognized as an expense in the statement of profit and loss.

ii) Defined Benefit Plans**a) Gratuity:**

The Group Gratuity Cash Accumulation Scheme, managed by Life Insurance Corporation of India is a defined benefit plan. The liability for gratuity is provided on the basis of actuarial valuation carried out by an independent actuary as at the Balance Sheet date. The present value of the company's obligation is determined on the basis of actuarial valuation at the year end, using the projected unit credit method and the fair value of plan assets is reduced from the gross obligations under the gratuity scheme to recognize the obligation on a net basis.

b) Leave Encashment:

Compensated absences which are not expected to occur within twelve months after the end of the period in which the employee renders the related services are recognised as a liability at the present value of the defined benefit obligation at the Balance Sheet date, determined on actuarial valuation basis using projected unit credit method. The discount rates used for determining the present value of the obligation under defined benefit plan, are based on the market yields on Government Securities as at the Balance Sheet date.

iii) The actuarial gain/loss is recognized in the statement of profit and loss in the period in which they occur.

(e) Fixed Assets

- (i) Fixed assets are stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation.
- (ii) Cost of fixed assets comprises its purchase price and any attributable expenditure (direct and indirect) for bringing the assets to its working condition for its intended use.
- (iii) Expenditure incurred on renovation/modernisation of the existing fixed assets is added to the book value of these assets where such renovation/modernisation increases the future benefit from them beyond their previously assessed standard of performance.

(f) Intangible Assets

Intangible assets are stated at cost less accumulated amount of amortisation.

(g) Depreciation

- i) Depreciation on tangible fixed assets is provided on straight line method on the basis of useful lives of such assets specified in Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013.
- ii) Assets costing Rs 5,000/- or less acquired during the year are depreciated at 100%.
- iii) The Intangible fixed assets acquired prior to 1st April 2014 are amortised over the revised useful life of the assets based on the indicative useful life of the assets mandated by Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013.

(h) Amortisation

Intangible asset are amortised on straight line method. These assets are amortised over their estimated useful life.

(i) CENVAT

Cenvat credit on excise duty/service tax paid on inputs, capital assets and input services is taken in accordance with the Cenvat Credit Rules, 2004.

(j) Inventories

Inventories are valued at cost or net realisable value, whichever is lower. The cost in respect of items of inventory is computed as under:

- In case of raw materials at FIFO basis plus direct expenses.
- In case of stores and spares at weighted average cost plus direct expenses.
- In case of work-in-progress at raw material cost plus conversion cost depending upon the stage of completion.
- In case of finished goods at raw material cost plus conversion cost, packing cost, excise duty and other overheads incurred to bring the goods to their present condition and location.

(k) Investments

Long term Investments are carried at cost less provision, if any, for decline in the value of such investments, which is other than temporary. Current investments are carried at lower of cost and fair value.

(l) Foreign Currency Transactions

- (a) Transactions in foreign currency are recorded on initial recognition in the reporting currency, by applying to the foreign currency amount the exchange rate between the reporting currency and the foreign currency at the date of transaction except in case of export invoices which are recorded at a rate notified by the Customs department for invoice purpose which approximates the actual rate as at the date of transaction. Exchange difference arising on realization of export sale is recognized as income or expense in the period in which they arise.
- b) At each balance sheet date foreign currency monetary items are reported at closing rates. Exchange differences arising on settlement of monetary items or on reporting the same at closing rate as at balance sheet date are recognized as income or expense.
- c) The premium or discount arising at the inception of a forward contract which is not intended for trading or speculation purpose is amortised as expense or income over the life of the contract. Exchange difference on such forward contracts is recognized in

the statement of profit or loss in the reporting period in which the exchange rates change. Any profit or loss arising on cancellation or renewal of a forward contract is recognised as income or as expense for the period.

(m) Borrowing Costs

Borrowing costs that are directly attributable to acquisition or construction of a qualifying asset are capitalised as a part of cost of such asset. Qualifying asset is one that takes substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use. All other borrowing costs are recognised as expenditure in the period in which these are incurred.

(n) Government grants and subsidies

Government grants available to the company are recognized when there is a reasonable assurance of compliance with the conditions attached to such grants and where benefits in respect thereof have been earned and it is reasonably certain that the ultimate collection will be made.

Government subsidy in the nature of promoter's contribution is credited to capital reserve.

Government subsidy related to specific fixed assets is deducted from the gross value of the assets concerned.

(o) Impairment of Assets

At each balance sheet date an assessment is made whether any indication exists that an asset has been impaired. If any such indication exists, an impairment loss i.e. the amount by which the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its recoverable amount is provided in the books of account.

(p) Accounting for Taxes on Income

Provision for taxation for the year comprises of current tax and deferred tax. Current tax is amount of Income-tax determined to be payable in accordance with the provisions of Income tax Act 1961. Deferred tax is the tax effect of timing difference between taxable income and accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods.

(q) Provision and Contingent Liabilities

(i) Provision is recognised (for liabilities that can be measured by using substantial degree of estimate) when:

- (a) the company has a present obligation as a result of a past event;
- (b) a probable outflow of resources embodying economic benefits is expected to settle the obligation ; and
- (c) the amount of the obligation can be reliably estimated.

(ii) Contingent liability is disclosed in case there is:

- (a) i. Possible obligation that arises from past events and existence of which will be confirmed only by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events not wholly within the control of the enterprise ; or
- ii. A reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation cannot be made.
- (b) A present obligation arising from past events but is not recognised :
 - i. When it is not probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation; or
 - ii. A reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation cannot be made.

(r) Earning per Share

Basic earning per share is calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period.

For the purpose of calculating diluted earning per share, the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period is adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.

(s) Lease

The assets acquired on lease wherein a significant portion of risks and rewards of ownership of an asset is retained by the lessor are classified as operating leases. Lease rentals paid for such leases are recognised as an expense on systematic basis over the terms of lease.

(t) Cash flow statement

The cash flow statement has been made in accordance with the Accounting Standard (AS) – 3 on "Cash flow statements" issued by the Companies (Accounting Standard) Rules, 2006.

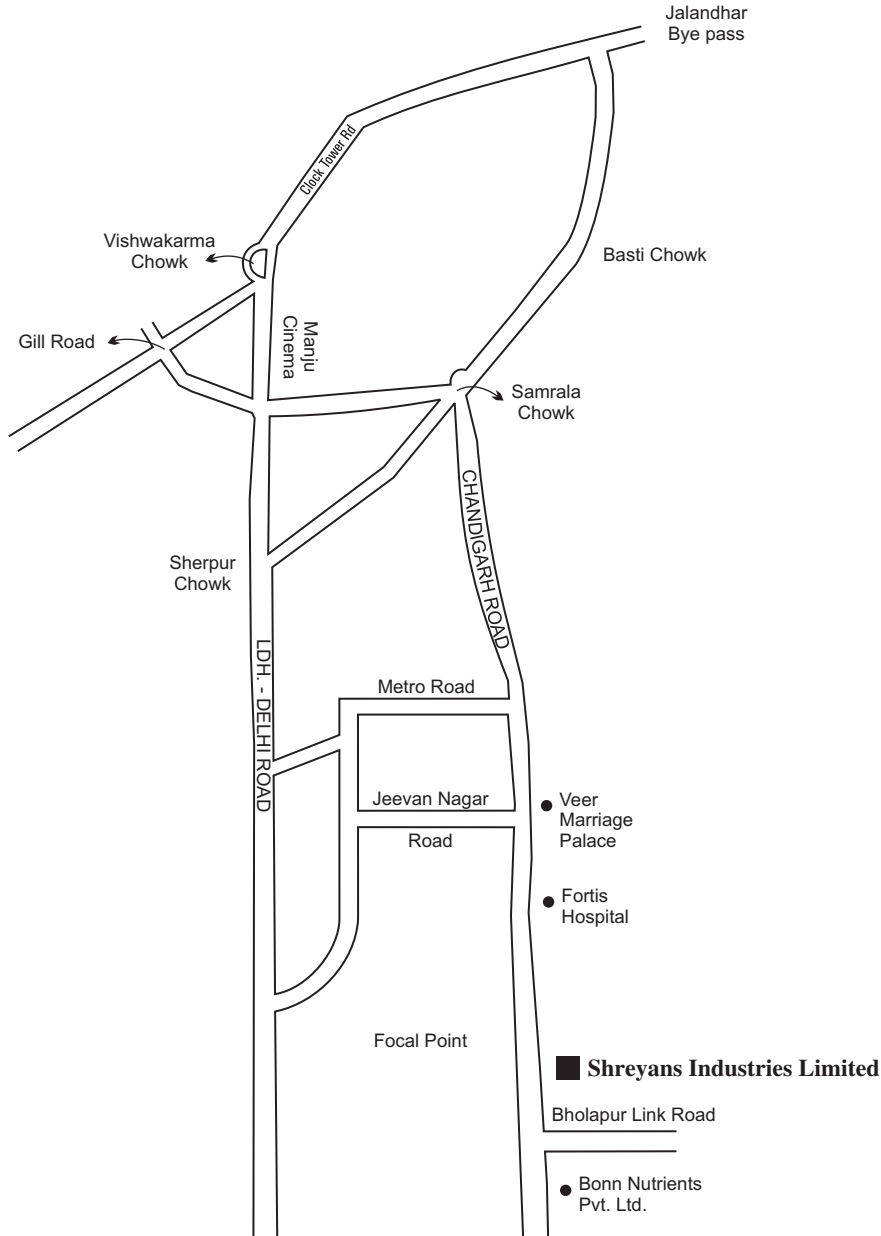
